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### **ACHIEVEMENTS FOR FY 23/24**



### 1. Nyankwanzi Farmer's Co-op Store (ACDP)

**Construction**: Completed

Facilities: Coffee value addition machines installed and operational

### 2. Two Coffee Hullers (Agri-LED Project)

Locations: Katooke Town Council, Kihuura Sub-County

Facilities: Equipped with solar driers, value addition machines installed

#### 3. Kyarusozi Integrated Farmers' Co-op Society


Installation: Coffee huller (1.5 tonnes/hour)

#### 4. Agricultural Support Distributions

Bee-Keeping: 195 KTB hives distributed

Seedlings: 82,216 Hass Avocado, 25,643 Macadamia









- Procured and distributed 450 straws of semen for artificial insemination in livestock
- Procured one Lap top/computer for Agriculture Division activities
- Received 7000 doses of rabies vaccine and 7000 doses of lumpy skin from MAAIF (Ministry of Agriculture Animal Industry and Fisheries) for vaccination of livestock.
- Received 06 meat inspection kits from MAAIF (Ministry of Agriculture Animal Industry and Fisheries)
- Completed renovation of a fish hatchery at Kijwiga

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#### **MICRO-SCALE IRRIGATION**

- 2,453 farmers have already been trained on micro-scale irrigation program through farmer field school.
- 236 farmers have been visited and their water resources assessed
- 74 farmers submitted for quotation have been returned and so far 48 farmers have already co-funded.
- 28 installations have been completed and 35 farmers are on-going.
- Microscale irrigation farmers were supported in fy 2023/2024 with amount of funds totaling 1,580,122,597/=

The overall objective is to increase the effectiveness of the interaction between the Government and its people in order to accelerate the realization of Governments long term goal of Socio-Economic transformation.

# FY 23/24 ACHIEVEMENTS:PDM IMPLEMENTATION



- A total of shs 16,683, 000,000 (Sixteen billion six hundred eighty three million shillings only) was credited on PDM SACCO accounts for the FY 2023/2024. i.e each PDM SACCO received 100.500,000= ( 100m for Parish Revolving Funds and 500,000 for PDM SACCO leaders to monitor the implementation of PDM activities in their parishes).
- To date a total of shillings 9,800,000,000= has been disbursed to 9800 households through wendi mobile money wallet system.
- All the 167 PDM SACCOs have been audited and Annual General Meetings (AGMs) for all 167 PDM SACCOs have been conducted



# **CHALLENGES IN PDM IMPLEMENTATION**



- Delayed release of PDM Revolving funds for Financial Year 2023/2024.
- There is no budget for Administrative costs for stakeholders at various levels to monitor the performance of PDM supported activities, which has affected implementation.
- Over expectations by the public to receive PDM Revolving Funds and yet PDM funds are for selected active poor households.
- Hailstorms that affected farmers in some Lower Local Governments
- Prevalence of pests and diseases that affect major crops and livestock





# ALLOCATION AND UTILIZATION OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Total funds allocation for FY 2025/2026 to Local Government from the agriculture sector are:

- 1. The Production and Marketing Grant (PMG) 774,045,840
- 2. District unconditional Grant Wage 1,987,102,560
- 3. Locally raised revenue 290,000,000
- 4. Program Condition Grant Development 1,352,201,411





### **KEY PRIORITIES FOR FY 25/26**

- Agricultural Production value addition, climate change and management of food security
- Facilitating the process of access to credit for small farmers at affordable costs; increasing long-term capital to support agro-industrialization through Uganda Development Bank (UDB) partner banks like Centenary, Opportunity bank, PostBank and Agriculture Credit Facility (ACF) among others.
- Supporting farmers to access micro-scale irrigation systems through the UGIFT program of cost sharing for acquisition of irrigation.
- Focus on implementation and mainstreaming of Climate change irrigation strategies such as introduction and adoption of drought-resistant and flood-prone crop varieties





### **KEY PRIORITIES FOR FY 25/26 CONT'D**

- Improved enterprise selection for our local farmers, through guiding and enabling them to identify and implement realistic technologies and enterprises suitable for their respective region across the country.
- Boosting access to water for production by operationalizing the already completed irrigation facilities.
- Provision of quality inputs, post-harvest handling, regulation and standards.
- Improving market access.



## **PROGRAMME CHALLENGES**



- Increased emergence of pests, vectors and diseases continue to affect production and productivity of agricultural enterprises.
- Lack of adequate agriculture financing framework makes it difficult for the majority of farmers to access agriculture credit.
- Low and declining agricultural productivity manifested by the wide gap in yields between research stations and farmer yields.
- Limited adherence to quality standards for inputs and products.
- Unstable production volumes due to reliance on rained agriculture, among others.
- Overwhelming demands for inputs against the limited budget.
